



Part-Time Funding for Higher Education

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for financial support you must meet our residence conditions and be on a course we support.

Generally, to qualify for support you must be:

- Ordinarily resident in the UK and Islands for 3 years immediately before the first day of the first academic year of the course;
- Settled in the UK as described in the Immigration Act 1971;
- Ordinarily resident in Scotland on the first day of the first academic year of the course.

If you do not meet these conditions, you may still be eligible to apply for support. You can get more information on our website.

HOW DO I APPLY

You can download part-time fee grant and DSA application forms from our website. For the part-time fee grant you must apply within 1 month of your course starting.

WHAT PART-TIME SUPPORT IS AVAILABLE

There is a range of financial support you can apply for. The following section outlines what is available:

TYPE OF SUPPORT	WHAT IS IT FOR	ELIGIBILITY
Part-Time Fee Grant	Up to £500, to help with the cost of tuition fees	<p>You must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">be earning £22,000 or less per year.be studying part-time with a minimum of 40 SCQF credits.be studying a course at Scottish Qualifications Framework Level 7-11. e.g. Higher Education qualifications such as HNC/HND, degrees, PG diplomas. It can also include Professional Development Awards and Continuous Professional Development courses.be in Scotland undertaking a course.not be receiving funding from any other Government learning or training schemes.
Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)	Available to students who have extra costs because of a disability or specific learning difficulty	<p>Your Higher Education course must be at least 50% of the length of the full-time course.</p> <p>Open University course must be at least 60 credits per year.</p>
Discretionary Funds	A fund available from the university or college for students experiencing particular financial hardship	Please contact your university or college for further information.
